

# Bell Building

The newly renovated NSO Building will be an anchor for the nonprofit campus development on Oakman Boulevard in collaboration with Focus: HOPE. The completed project will include:

- New headquarters for NSO, including offices for 200 NSO employees
- 155 one-bedroom apartments for formerly homeless individuals
- Federally qualified health care clinic available to both building and neighborhood residents
- Supportive services such as addiction treatment, mental health counseling and case management for the building and neighborhood residents

The 155 one-bedroom, supportive housing apartments NSO is creating in the former Michigan Bell Building is a cost effective way to move homeless individuals off the streets and into a safe environment where they can receive life-restoring supportive services.

When complete, the new NSO building will house 155 formerly homeless individuals, provide working and training space for 200 NSO employees, and act as an economic engine for the neighborhood.

Perhaps most importantly, NSO's supportive housing project will model a solution to chronic homelessness that has proven successful in cities from New York to Denver to San Francisco. NSO is proud to be at the forefront of this movement to end homelessness in Detroit.

The Bell Building's lease will be up on July 23rd, 2012.
